Covid

We are operating in the Orange setting!

At Orange, face masks are no longer required at school.

However, public health advice is that masks continue to be strongly encouraged when indoors. Wearing a mask is a key health measure that slows the spread of

COVID-19 in indoor settings. For that reason, we ask that visitors to the school, including parents and whānau, wear a mask whenever they are indoors on school grounds.

Masks

Rather than saying you don't have to wear masks, I suggest you should. The decision is up to you currently whether your child needs to wear a mask. I still will change it from being optional if needed.

It is not optional for visitors or parents who come on-site. They must wear masks. We are still trying to keep the parents off-site as much as possible. So please stay out of school at pick up and drop off times.

But please (if they are Year 4+), all students need to continue to bring a mask to school every day. There may be times that we'll ask them to wear a mask, too – for example, when we have an assembly. If there are cases at school or in the community, we may ask that masks be worn.

After School,

Students are now asked to sit down on the deck by the staff room if not going home on a bus. They are not playing. Please remember that if you are not having your child take the bus, they will need to be picked up at 2-30pm when school closes. They will be waiting in the 'pick-up spot', so it is easier for the duty teacher to manage the end of the day. Conversely, students coming to school should not be at school till 8 am if being dropped off.

Speed limit Changes Around our School LAST CHANCE

Have your say on safer speeds – from 17 May to 14 June.

Waka Kotahi, NZ Transport Agency, is reviewing speeds at schools and townships on state highways in Northland and North Auckland – to set safer speed limits for everyone. This includes collaborating with iwi and hapū on signage for marae.

They are consulting on new proposed speed limits at schools and townships on 11 corridors of state highways. This includes a proposal for

- a new permanent speed limit of 80km/h and
- a variable speed limit of 60km/h in the area surrounding Tauhoa School.

Variable speed limit signs are electronic and legally enforceable. They are used to getting traffic to slow down during the peak school periods when students are arriving and when they are going home at the end of the day.

Variable speed limits – additional information

- Electronic variable speed limit signs are legally enforceable and used to get traffic to slow down during the peak school periods when students are arriving and at the end of the day when they are going home.
- The length of these peak periods when the school should turn on the signs will vary from school to school.
- Waka Kotahi will work with the school to determine both the length of time the signs should be turned on and when the peak school periods are.
- When a variable speed limit sign is active, the speed limit is 30km/h at schools where people tend to walk along the road or 60km/h where the main safety risk is turning vehicles.
