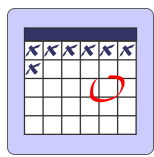

Buses

At the recent bus meeting for Rodney schools, we talked about the following issues:

Firstly, students will be dropped off at their stop in Wellsford and not taken to the depot if parents are not there to pick them up. Please make sure you are at the bus stop at least ten minutes before the bus is due.

Secondly, **and this is really important**, Over the next few weeks at any time the bus runs could change or be cancelled. This will happen if we need to merge runs to cope with drivers with covid or having to isolate.

This is where having Skool Loop on your phone and also having it updated is vital!

If you can not have this app on your phone, please phone the office to register this and find a fellow parent to relay information to you when a notification comes through Skool Loop.

Critical Workers

Critical workers are workers that are needed to maintain services that support the public Like Nurses or education workers to keep a school open. They are people who would be isolated with a household contact who has a positive case of covid.

These workers are tested daily and are separated as much as possible from others except for their work. This is part of Phase 3 of the red light. It allows organisations to still run. We have a critical worker, and they are following these procedures.

How to work out your 10 days of self-isolation



start over if you test positive

Find out what you need to do if:	you are positive for COVID-19	you are a Household Contact (living with a positive case)*
Day 0	The day you test positive or start experiencing symptoms, whichever is earliest.	Your Day 0 is the same Day 0 as the first positive case in your household.
Day 3	-	Get a Day 3 test today, or sooner if symptoms develop. If it's positive, start a new 10 days of self-isolation.
Day 10	-	Get a Day 10 test today, or sooner if symptoms develop. If it's positive, start a new 10 days of self-isolation.
Day 11	After 10 days, as long as you are free of COVID-19 symptoms, you will be free to leave self-isolation.	After 10 days, as long as you have a negative Day 10 test result and no COVID-19 symptoms, you will be free to leave self-isolation.
