Covid

Welcome to School under Orange!

At Orange, face masks are no longer required at school.

However public health advice is that masks continue to be strongly encouraged when indoors. Wearing a mask is a key health measure that slows the spread of COVID-19 in indoor settings. For that reason, we ask that visitors to the school, including parents and whānau, wear a mask whenever they are indoors on school grounds.

We also ask that your child (if they are Year 4+) continues to bring a mask to school every day. There may be times that we'll ask them to wear a mask, too – for example, when we are having an assembly. If there are a high number of cases at school or in the community, we may ask that masks be worn in classrooms for a time.

In School Lunches

We will be continuing with Te Hana Marae supplying this for term 2. Once I can confirm we have an on site chief for term 3, I will cancel this contract. We will all be eating together as a community in the Atuanui Room. or on the deck. Please remember that if your child is not eating our school provided lunch their lunch must be a healthy option meal. No pies and bags chips etc are to be in our lunches brought to school
