Ngā mihi o te tau hou.

We welcome Noah and Violet Gole and the Cole family to our Tauhoa School community. Our school roll now stands at 57.

I have been quite overwhelmed with the loss of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. This brings many changes for little things from Scout promises to pledges and of course, we now sing 'God save the King.'

This is a great segway into our change in our system of looking at behaviours at Tauhoa School.

As parents, we start to develop our children's resilience and self-awareness from word dot. That simple game of peek-a-boo is for our child's brain the beginning of developing resilience: "Mum's gone, where is she? Oh, it's all good she's back again."

Children need to learn two major things. One is to cope with change and uncertainty, to develop resilience and the other is to be aware of themselves and their behaviour and its impact on others.

We have been quite surprised by some of our student's lack of ability to cope with change or to control their responses when things don't go as they plan or do not want to go along with something happening.

We also have reviewed how we respond to our students and their behaviour. Using zones to indicate where a student is 'operating' in behavioural terms, students are now beginning to be directed to the required behaviour based on a colour system.

We are wanting our students to be functioning in the Blue Zone.

Blue zone means they are behaving in a way that meets our school values of Respectful, empathic, self-aware and trustworthy.

Students will be reminded that they are doing the right thing. Those who have been working well and focusing on their learning while meeting our school values will receive a blue award. These will be posted to your home address so you can acknowledge your child's success in their learning.

Green is the next zone and this is when a student is off task or not meeting a teacher's expectations. A student will be told they have moved into this zone and redirected to a task. Hopefully, they will go back into the blue zone.

Yellow is the next zone, this is when a teacher has had to again ask a student to comply with what's being asked for a second time. Students will be asked to take time to reflect on their behaviour. A reflection sheet will be completed and discussed with the teacher concerned. Once again we are wanting a student to again rethink their behaviour and move back into the blue zone.

Orange zone is the next step and from tomorrow, if a student's behaviour has been judged to be in the Orange zone they will have completed a reflection sheet and had a restorative conversation with a teacher. The reflection sheet will be sent home to you so that you also are aware of their behaviour and its impact on them and others at school.


**Red** zone: This is a point where we are having a meeting and deciding how we as a team can help your child with their behaviour or approach to learning. This might also mean asking for support from outside agencies.

#### Developing Resilience

To support our students to develop resilience we are ensuring that it is ok to win and it's ok to lose or try and get something wrong. To this end, we have purchased good old games like snakes and ladders, where there are winners and losers.
