AG Day and Gala.

This is our major fundraiser, and we hold this on a long weekend for several reasons.

Looking to 2024 Roll Numbers

Please let the office know if you have a child due to start next year. You may know others that want to attend the best little community school in the North. Please get them to ring the office. Please let us know if you see your child leaving and not attending in 2024. We will shortly need to decide the number of spaces to offer to out-of-zone students. We must maintain a certain level roll number to remain a 3-teacher school.

Heads up

We are also starting to look at significant events in 2024. We have a whole school 'camp'. This means we bring activities to school for everyone, and certain classes stay over at school or on the reserve for different amounts of time. For example, the senior class will camp out in tents all week: the middle school room for a few nights and the juniors one night. During that time, we travel for a big day out or have a climbing wall come to school. Dates are still to be finalised, but there will be a cost for the camp aspect for all classes in week 3 or 4 of the first term.

I have also started looking at restarting our senior class (Year 6 to 8) to visit Hillary Outdoor Centre at Tongariro in Term 3 of next year. This camp will cost approximately \$350 for the week away, depending on how much sponsorship I can get and the mode of transport (train or van). Cleasby Whanau will probably be fundraising for this event.
