Bus Usage and changes

Please remember that if you are changing anything to do with your child's transport home please ring the school. The person in charge of the buses at the end of the day checks the bus book for messages and clears the phone. If you rely on emails, they may not be seen as a staff member you send it to could be away that day.

Please also remember that it is only sometimes possible to travel on a different bus. Our Bus 2 is at capacity, and we might not be able to fit an extra student on board. Please check before making plans that require this.

Kids Kare

Sadly due to the lack of numbers, our Kids Kare programme will be closing for 2024. If you are ever stuck however please contact the school as we may be able to provide some cover if you are running late for pick-up and children cannot be collected by 2.30pm. Kids Kare last session will be Friday 8th December.

Trip to Tiritiri Matangi

We have been sponsored for years 4 to 8 to go on a trip to Tiri on 13th December. The school will fund the bus and the cost for our 0-3 students to attend. If parents wish to also come with us, there is a cost of \$47.50, and parents will need to carpool to Gulf Harbour, where we meet the ferry. We have to leave school early and will be home late that day. I will arrange for a bus to transport students home if necessary. Permission for this trip will go out next week.

Athletics Day

This is a busy day for us at Tauhoa as we, as a community, run both the event and the fundraising canteen on the day. We will need parents and whanau to help do both on the day. Our whole school attends, and a bus will be booked for transport. A form asking for your help is coming home with this Tattler.
