Education Review Office

The Education Review Office (ERO) has shifted to a more developmental approach to evaluation that supports each school's improvement over time. Key features of the new approach, Te Ara Huarau, are that ERO will:

- work with all schools in an ongoing way rather than as a one-off event
- connect with each school's strategic planning and reporting cycle as part of their improvement journey
- work in partnership with schools, collaborating in support of equitable and excellent outcomes for all learners
- As a result, each school will:
- have a dedicated ERO Evaluation Partner who works alongside the school
- have a different experience depending on needs, strengths, and their school's specific evaluation focus will be on a three-year evaluation cycle

What will public reporting on ERO's website look like?

As schools transition into the approach, ERO will work with schools to publish a one-off Profile Report. This will focus on the strategic goals schools have to improve learner outcomes and what the school seeks to achieve through the evaluation.

All schools will have a Te Ara Huarau / School Evaluation Report within a three-year cycle. This report includes information about the All schools will receive a Board Assurance with Regulatory and Legislative

Requirements Report about their board's attestation to meeting those requirements. Provision for International Students and Hostel Reports will be published where applicable.

Other reporting

Progress Reports - These reports are not published on ERO's website.

Progress reports will provide specific information for the audience, such as your board, the community or the Ministry of Education.

2024 Bus changes - Bus 2

2024 will see our Bus 2 changing to a full route for at least the first six months. This will mean that the bus will go along Wharehine Road and JV Grant and Underwood, then carry on to Wellsford to drop off college students and collect our Wellsford students. Then travel back along State Highway 16 to Ingleton, then over the Cleasby's to school. I have asked for timings to be worked out this term so everyone will know where we are meant to be and when.

The extra good news is that from now on, all out-of-zone students will no longer have to pay to go on the bus in 2024.

Kids Kare

Sadly, our Kids Kare programme will close for 2024 due to the need for more numbers. If you are ever stuck however, please contact the school as we may be able to provide some cover if you are running late for pick-up and children cannot be collected by 2.30 pm. Kids Kare's last session will be Friday, 8th December.

Trip to Tiritiri Matangi

We have been sponsored for years 4 to 8 to go on a trip to Tiri on 13th December. The school will fund the bus and the cost for our 0-3 students to attend. If parents wish to also come with us, there is a cost of \$47.50, and parents will need to carpool to Gulf Harbour, where we meet the ferry. We have to leave school early and will be home late that day. I will arrange for a bus to transport students home if necessary. Permission for this trip will go out next week.

Athletics Day: Help!

This is a busy day for us at Tauhoa as we, as a community, run both the event and the fundraising canteen on the day. We will need parents and whanau to help do both on the day. Our whole school attends, and a bus will be booked for transport. A form asking for your help went home last week, sadly, we have not had a great response for helpers. If anything changes and you decide you could help just let the office know please.

2024

We have phone calls and emails from parents asking for their children to come to our school from out of our zone. Please let the office know if you know of any in-zone enrollments for 2024 or if your child will not attend next year. I am maintaining class sizes while keeping the roll at a size that keeps us with three teachers. It seems people are starting to realise we are the "Best of the best of the best!" (Ask your children if you don't understand.)
