When we said 'Go Pink' for Pink Shirt Day, Tauhoa School went Pink! As you can see above, our school rose to celebrate diversity and acceptance and stand up against bullying! The senior pupils set the tone with some amazing costumes. We raised 95 dollars for the Mental Health Foundation.

Pink Shirt Day reminds me that our school is a bully-free zone. What is bullying?

"It's easy to assume everyone knows what bullying is. However, the term is often used to describe other aggressive behaviour. This can make it hard for schools, parents, whānau, and the wider community to consistently identify and deal with bullying when it happens. Most widely accepted definitions of bullying are based on four elements: bullying is deliberate, harmful, involves a power imbalance, and has an element of repetition."

Whether bullying is physical, verbal, or social (relational), four widely-accepted factors can be used to identify it:

- Bullying is deliberate harming another person intentionally
- Bullying involves a misuse of power in a relationship
- Bullying is usually not a one-off it is repeated or has the potential to be repeated over time
- Bullying involves behaviour that can cause harm it is not a normal part of growing up.

# **RRS Soccer & Hockey years 4-8**

Soccer and Hockey day will be at Port Albert Domain on Tuesday 18th June. Students will travel by bus, They will need a full lunch and drink bottle, sports uniforms will be provided on the day.

## **Attendance Term 1 Figure**

The report from Every Day Matters has been released, and our regular attendance at school for term 1 was only 63%. That 37 students out of 64 are coming to school regularly. Another disastrous figure was our lateness to school. Only 65% of our students are on time for school daily. That means 23 students don't get to school by 8-30 to start the day! ( school buses don't count)

Please remember that your child must come to school every day so they don't miss out on the building blocks to support learning a topic. Students who do not attend regularly find friendships hard to maintain.
