I have seen a few Blue Zone awards heading to the post box last term. Seeing so many of our students learning and playing in the blue zone is great. This means they are focused on success. They maintain our school values of respect, empathy, self-awareness, and trustworthiness in everything they do at school. We use this language when we talk about behaviour, "I can see you

have moved into the green zone, think about what you are doing and how you can go back to work / learn / play in the blue zone."
