We have obtained permission to sell tickets for a visit to Gibbs Farm on Thursday 10th October. This presents an excellent opportunity to raise funds for a school van. The amenities, such as toilets, are limited and spread far apart. Children cannot climb on sculptures, and the walk is approximately 6 kilometres.

Attendance and Engagement

Education Counts has released the report for term two attendance. Last term's attendance rate was 63%, which is 16% higher than in the same term last year. However, this is still below the government's goal of 70% student attendance 90% of the time. Another concerning finding is that only 68% of our students are arriving on time, indicating that many students are not present when the roll is taken in their class. The time before class starts is important as it allows children to socialise with friends, organise their belongings, and settle in before the day begins.

To the 32% of students arriving late, let's make an effort to be punctual! Thank you.
